



## CHEA SERVICE COMMITMENTS

In order for CHEA to continue to be a blessing to its members, it is vital that each member family commit to at least one area of service. **Because every CHEA function is a reflection of CHEA itself and should reflect the conservative values of our organization, the activities of each position are subject to approval of the CHEA officers.** Below is a description of each CHEA service opportunity.

SERVICE POSITION	DESCRIPTION
Art Fair	One or more families who organize an exhibit of art by CHEA students (to be coordinated with Fine Arts Night).
Blessed Expectations	One to two moms who feature the Blessed Expectations article in our newsletter and coordinate meals for new moms with the Meal Coordinator.
Camping	One to two families who organize spring and/or fall family camping trips.
CHEA Mentors	One to two moms (with many years of homeschooling experience) who will be available over the phone to provide support and guidance for other CHEA moms.
Community Service Projects	One to two families who organize community service projects or volunteer opportunities for participation by CHEA families.
Computer Corner	One family who locates and submits to our newsletter websites that are safe learning tools for CHEA students.
Curriculum Coordinator	One to two families who keep CHEA updated on current curriculum through articles submitted to our newsletter. May also organize a curriculum night in which families share their experiences with a variety of different curriculums.
Field Trip Committee	One to two families who assist the 2nd Vice President with field trips.
Fine Arts Night	One or two families who organize this night in which CHEA students share music, recitations of Scripture, stories, historical accounts, dramatic presentations, etc.
Home School News Watch	One family who keeps CHEA updated on any news in politics or legal issues of interest to homeschoolers via the newsletter.
Ladies' Fellowships	One to three women who organize monthly fellowships in which CHEA moms can get to know each other.
Little Ladies' Fellowships	One to three families who organize periodic fellowships in which young ladies can get to know each other and enjoy fellowship.
Meal Preparation Coordinator	One family who coordinates preparation and delivery of meals for a CHEA family in need.
Pancake Breakfast	One to two families who organize a pancake breakfast and fellowship for CHEA families one Saturday morning in March (to be coordinated with the Science Fair).
Reading Programs	One or two families who organize participation in reading programs such as Pizza Hut's Book It, Braum's Book Buddy, and Read To Succeed.
Recognition Night	One or two families who organize this end of the year night in which CHEA students are recognized for specific character and academic achievements.
Science Fair	One or two families who organize and conduct the Science Fair (to be coordinated with the Pancake Breakfast).
Spelling Bee	One to two families who organize and conduct the Spelling Bees that lead up to the Scripps Howard National Spelling Bee.
Thanksgiving Fellowship	One to two families who organize a dinner and fellowship for CHEA families to celebrate Thanksgiving together.
Used Book Sale	One or two families who organize this event in which homeschoolers rent tables to sell used books and curriculum. Sale conducted no later than 2 weeks prior to Arlington Home School Book Fair.
Website	One family who keeps the CHEA website updated with the latest CHEA information.
Youth Activities	One or two families who organize and plan appropriate opportunities for CHEA youth to fellowship and engage in worthwhile activities.
Youth Newsletter	One family who organizes, coordinates, and provides editorial oversight for CHEA youth in the planning, development, and production of a periodic youth-oriented newsletter.
ZIPLINE Coordinator	One family who maintains the CHEA email list up to date and distributes emails via ZIPLINE when requests meet ZIPLINE policies.
